# **SOLID WASTE OPERATIONS UPDATE**

Documents:

Glenn County Solid Waste (GCSW) Update - 1/26/2023

Proceedings:

Chair Arnold introduced the item.

Ms. Richardson went over the GCSW Update and touched on the following:

Tonnage - through entire year of 2022, sent to Anderson Landfill for disposal, was 26,633 and 6,633 tons of recycled materials diverted. Up approximately 2,000 tons from 2021. Mentioning Glenn County has a very high diversion rate.

Beverage Contain Recycling City/County Payment Program -\$20,000 grant - Working with General Services and the cities of Glenn County for possible needs at the schools and parks, to utilize the grant funding still available.

Household Hazardous Waste Discretionary Grants - \$100,000 grant - We are in the middle of our grant cycle and held an event at the Transfer Station on October 29, 2022 and collected 19 pallets of household hazardous waste; very successful event.

Local Government Waste Tire Amnesty Grant - \$50,000 grant - We have collected 2.831 tires to date. Moving forward looking into holding an agricultural event to bring in larger tires. Issue is you have to stay within a \$5 threshold of cost per tire and when you bring in larger tires it tends to bumps that cost up. We will start holding events again this summer.

Used Oil Payment Program (OPP) - \$10,000 grant - On going for any entity to sign up as a certified collector for the public to drop off and then is disposed of free of charge for that facility. Always looking for

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agricultural entities to be certified collectors, currently we only have the Transfer Station which accepts up to 55 gallons at a time.

Member Williams inquired on the reasoning for entities not wanting to become certified centers, was it due to possible contamination issues. Ms. Richardson explained being certified would allow CalRecycle to come to their facility for inspections, per regulations. She also shared, if there were any contamination issues, the grant would cover the cleanup and removal.

**Community Clean Up Day** – Glenn County partnered with Waste Management. Event was held at the Transfer Station on November 5, 2022. We disposed of or recycled 30.76 tons at no cost. Very busy day with 268 vehicles coming through. Looking to have this event at the Transfer Station annually.

Member Carmon asked if we could hold more of these events as they are so successful. Maybe we wouldn't have as many people illegally dumping.

Ms. Richardson replied that our current agreement with Waste Management only allows for two County events and one per City annually, that are reimbursed by Waste Management. Anymore would have to be funded by the County.

Diana Ramirez, Waste Management (WM), shared WM will be having a workshop on illegal dumping, as it is a statewide issue. She will send us an invite.

Chair Arnold requested a cost analyst for the event so that we may look into the possibility if funded by the County. Also, a possibility to split with Cities.

SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program – \$60,589 grant - CalRecycle one-time grant program to assist with implementation process. We are partnering with Environmental Health as they have a large cost with the majority of implementation right now being on the eatable food recovery. Funds will also be used towards the Master Plan Update and the preparation of the SB 1383 full implementation in 2026.

**GCWMRA 5-Year CIWMP** - Due October 31, 2023 – we will provide the plan with comments from the cities and any proposed changes at the next meeting on April 27, 2023 for your review.

Solid Waste Site - Storm Damage and Flooding

Chair Arnold introduced the item. Ms. Richardson reported approximately \$15,000 of damage to the Landfill Closure project. This

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has been included in the report and hoping this will be covered by FEMA. Temporary repairs have been made. Flooding on County Road 33 caused evacuation and closure of the Transfer Station on the afternoon of Saturday, January 14<sup>th</sup> but we were able to reopen on Monday.

## **BYLAWS**

# GLENN COUNTY WASTE MANAGEMENT REGIONAL AGENCY

#### **ARTICLE 1.0 Name and Address**

Section 1.1 Name

The name of this agency shall be Glenn County Waste Management Regional Agency, as created by Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement dated March 17, 1998 between City of Willows, City of Orland and County of Glenn, and shall also be known, as, and hereafter referred to as, "Regional Agency".

Section 1.2 Address

The principal office for the transaction of business shall be 777 North Colusa Street, Willows, California 95988. The Regional Agency may at any time or from time to time, change the location of the principal office from one location to another within Glenn County.

**ARTICLE 2.0 Purpose** - The purpose of these bylaws is to establish Board terms and meeting procedures not specifically addressed in the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement.

#### **ARTICLE 3.0**

Section 3.1 Voting

Each Governing Board members shall have one vote.

Section 3.2 Officers

Officers of the commission are a chairperson and vice-chairperson elected annually at the first meeting of the calendar year.

Section 3.3 Executive Director

The Executive Director shall be the Glenn County Director of Public Works.

Section 3.4 Terms

The term served by members shall be one year, commencing on January 1 of each year.

Section 3.5 Regular Meetings

Regular meetings of the Board shall be held, at a minimum, once quarterly. The Board may hold other regular business meetings as needed to conduct business. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at any place, within or without the State, which has been designated and agreed upon

by the Board. In the absence of this designation, regular meetings shall be held at the principal office of the Agency.

# Section 3.6 Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be held either at a place designated or at the principal office.

# Section 3.7 Quorum

The presence of three Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business by the Board. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Board at a meeting duly held at which a quorum was present shall be regarded as the act of the Board of Directors, unless a greater number be required by law.

# Section 3.8 <u>Meeting Notices</u>

Notice of each meeting, whether regular or special, shall be delivered to each Board member. Such notices shall be received no less than three (3) days before each meeting. Notices shall specify the time and place of the meeting, and shall include the agenda and informational packets on each item of business to be considered for action.

# Section 3.9 Meeting Minutes

The minutes of all official meetings of Regional Agency will be made available to the Board prior to the next scheduled meeting of the Regional Agency. Minutes shall be received no less than three (3) days before each meeting. Once approved at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board, the minutes are officially entered a permanent record.

**ARTICLE 4.0 Bylaw Amendment** - These bylaws may be proposed, amended or repealed, and new bylaws proposed to be adopted by the vote of a majority of the Board at any Regional Agency meeting, providing that the proposed amendment or repeal of any part or all of these bylaws, or new bylaws was proposed at a previous regular meeting of the Board.

**ARTICLE 5.0 Rules of Order** - The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Regional Agency in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order (Standing Rules) the Regional Agency may adopt.

**ARTICLE 6.0 Acknowledgement of Regional Agency** - All solid waste, AB 939, and SB 1383 programs implemented on behalf of the member agencies shall, whenever possible, publicly acknowledge the Regional Agency as the joint effort of the County of Glenn and the cities of Orland and Willows.

# Beverage Container Recycling City/County Payment Program

## Household Hazardous Waste Discretionary Grants

#### \$100,000 Awarded

- \$46,000 for Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events
- \$53,400 for partnership with California Product Stewardship Council to create a multi-media public education campaign
  to inform the public of the best practices of HHW management. This will include specific materials often mishandled in
  the waste stream (specifically 1 lb propane cylinders and general HHW) as well as basic facility information, including
  days and hours of operation, common HHW materials accepted and options for reuse of these material

The Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) grants are primarily competitive grants made available by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) per Public Resources Code, Division 30, Part 7, Article 3.5, Section 47200 to help local governments establish or expand HHW collection programs.

The October 29, 2022 event at the Glenn County Transfer Station collected 19 pallets of Household Hazardous Waste for disposal.

## Local Government Waste Tire Amnesty Grant

#### \$50,000 Awarded

Waste Tire Amnesty Grants include funds for date-specific events for the public and are not intended for the disposal of waste tires from waste tire generating businesses (PRC §42954(7)). Amnesty events 1) allow citizens to bring waste tires to convenient locations for proper management up to twice per month per location or 2) can consist of a coupon program that allows citizens to bring in waste tires on specified days.

This non-competitive grant program provides \$60,589.00 of funding to assist with the implementation of regulation requirements associated with SB 1383, including but not limited to:

- Education and outreach (includes: organic waste & edible food recovery)
- Enforcement and Inspection
- Program Evaluation/Gap Analysis
- Procurement Requirements
- Record Keeping
