Purpose: *To plan for a coordinated and effective medical response to a mass medical disaster in Butte and Glenn Counties*

1) Welcome/Introductions

- a. New Emergency Preparedness Program Manager, Michele Hinkle

2) HPP Updates

- a. Updating disaster contact lists
 - 1. Must be updated periodically. Some individuals listed have been separated for a long time without being removed from sites
- b. SitRep/Resource Requests
 - 1. Anything out of the ordinary needs to be communicated to MHOAC
 - a. Regardless of issue, please report all issues to appropriate county personnel
 - b. Resource requests must be submitted prior to order fulfillment
- c. 30 day supply PPE from CDPH and OES. Offer expires 2/28/22. The following items are offered. Please send resource request if interested to PublicHealthDOC@buttecounty.net
 - 1. Procedural masks
 - 2. BYD N95 masks
 - 3. Face Shields
 - 4. Hand sanitizer (16.9 ounce per bottle size only)
 - 5. Goggles
 - 6. Gowns
 - 7. Nitrile gloves (Medium, Large and XL only)
 - 8. Disinfecting wipes (400 count and 80 count)
- d. CHEMPACK Exercise for Region III
 - 1. April 14th, 2022
 - 2. Butte County CHEMPACK training has now been scheduled for March 21st at Enloe Conference Center. Two- 2 hour classes will be held. Flyer emailed to HCC 2/2/22
 - 3. CHEMPACK is to be activated in the event of nerve agent\organophosphate exposure. These agents are treatment for these exposures and must be

administered 60-90 minutes of exposure. Training\drill will train deployment, distribution, administration, etc.

4. The ED must completely fill out the form on the S-SV website which includes filling in the MHOAC name, email and phone number. Must also include transfer centers contacted and dates and times of contact in comment section.

5. If surge build bed secured but transportation becomes an issue, please make sure to contact receiving facility to update on ETA.

If patient is transferring to surge buildout, complete [Region III Hospital Patient Transfer to Surge Buildout Bed Notification Form](#)

If MHOAC\RDMHS assistance required for transfer, complete [Region III MHOAC Hospital Patient Transfer Assistance Request Form](#)

6. When the ED submits the form, the MHOAC and the RDMHS will receive an email and a copy of the form
7. Once the MHOAC receives the form, they will call to verify the information with the ED and then MHOAC will contact on-call RDMHS
8. If transferring a qualifying SNF COVID-19 positive individual, Contact Shadowbrook via fax at (530) 653-2284 for placement in SNF Red Zone Surge Buildout. Fax goes directly to email.
9. Transfers, at this time, are taking longer due to surges
10. If a transfer requires specialty care, doctor to doctor calls are advantageous. Please notify MHOAC if there are any special circumstances so information may be relayed to RDMHS

3) COVID-19 Updates

a. Vaccination clinics

1. Current Omicron surge

a. Seeing highest daily cases since start of pandemic

- i. Over last 3 weeks, total case count increased by 6,000
- ii. 5 more deaths
- iii. 1700 sick\quarantined
- iv. Hospitalizations have doubled
- v. 51.1% fully vaccinated. Unvaccinated have risk of becoming sicker from COVID
- vi. Decline in vaccination clinics. Majority of those attending are booster doses

vii. Current vaccination clinic schedule

1. Chico

- a. Tues- Moderna and Pfizer
- b. Wed- Pfizer
- c. Thurs- Pfizer for 5-11 yo

2. Oroville Hospital

- a. Thurs- all manufacturers

3. Orchard Hospital

- a. Mon-Fri- all manufacturers through clinic
- b. Antigen test availability
 - 1. Receiving test requests. Currently have a limited supply. Delays in order fulfillment due to staff lack of availability
 - 2. [CMS Guidance for the Use of Expired SARS-CoV-2 Tests](#)
 - a. CMS allows use of expired testing supplies in the absence of "in date" supplies, provided the above guidelines are met
- c. BCPH EP able to assist but must prioritize CDPH licensed facilities.
- d. Staffing requests through State
 - 1. Facilities must first reach out to staffing agencies
 - 2. If unable to find staffing, resource request and ancillary staffing forms must be sent to PublicHealthDOC@ButteCounty.net
 - 3. Additional staffing available from State
- e. Vaccination deadline for Healthcare Workers- March 1
 - 1. Extended from Feb 1
- f. mAb distribution
 - 1. Enloe- Evusheld available. Requires referral, unable to transfer to another site
 - 2. Molnupivir and Paxlovid
 - a. Allocated to outpatient pharmacies
 - 3. Sotrovimab
 - a. Allocated to hospitals
 - 4. Regen-COV\Bam-Ete
 - a. No longer available due to lack of efficacy with Omicron variant
